ORDER

The court held a hearing this date on a review of the bail set on a capias issued by this court. See list for those appearing. Atty. Werme on behalf of Mr. Johnson argued that they are not here seeking a lower bail but to have the finding of contempt vacated. Atty. Ross on behalf of Jennifer Johnson objected and indicated that bail should be set with certain conditions in place. He requested that there be a restraint against Mr. Johnson in respect to Mrs. Johnson, that Mr. Johnson not be allowed to possess any firearms and that the home and vehicles be searched to make sure all weapons are secured. Atty. Werme indicated that Mr. Johnson would be willing to have his home searched but only for money, not for weapons.

Atty. Werme argued that the court should vacate the order of contempt. The court denies the request. Mr. Johnson had a fair opportunity to be heard on the issues and has failed to comply. The court found he has the ability to comply and the findings of this court have been affirmed by the Supreme Court.

The court has considered the arguments of the parties and the following order is issued:

- Bail shall remain as set. Should Mr. Johnson post the cash bail required, he shall be released from the House of Corrections;

- Should Mr. Johnson be released, the court imposes the following conditions: he shall not enter Jennifer's home and shall not harass, intimidate or threaten her in any manner; and he shall relinquish to the Londonderry Police any firearms or dangerous weapons in his possession or in the possession of any third party on his behalf.

Atty. Ross argued that Mr. Johnson is a threat of safety. Atty. Werme indicated that her client is not a threat to Jennifer. She added, though, that her client is only angry at the court. The court finds that Mr. Johnson does present a safety concern to the community and therefore is requiring the relinquishment of his firearms and weapons until further court order.

All prior orders not inconsistent remain in full force and effect.
